### Main Point for the Series:

Jesus Puts the Pieces Back Together.

Peter, the fishermen, was brash, bold and impulsive. Despite his desire to do good, Peter didn't always do the right thing. He came close to wrecking things quite a few times; but Jesus was always there providing forgiveness and redemption.

We may feel that we've "wrecked it" when it comes to the bad things we've done; but if we will turn to Jesus, He will put our broken pieces back together.

No sin or mistake is bigger than God's forgiveness.

### Memory Verse:

Psalm 34:18 (NirV)

The Lord is close to those whose hearts have been broken.

He saves those whose spirits have been crushed.

### Main Point for the Week:

Peter was a fisherman. He knew the times and the places that fish could be caught. So it wasn't a coincidence that he and the other disciples fished when and where they did. However, a long night of fishing had produced nothing. They likely were about to give up on catching anything when Jesus called out from shore and told them they'd find fish on the other side of the boat. They probably laughed at the suggestion! But for some reason—maybe something in them wondered if the lone figure on the shore could be Jesus—they obeyed what the man said!

Suddenly Peter's priorities changed: he knew it was Jesus who had spoken to them from the shore. Peter was more excited about seeing Jesus than about bringing in the huge catch of fish that they'd hoped for all night!

The miraculous catch of fish revealed Jesus to Peter.

Working without Jesus doesn't work.

## This Week's Passage: John 21:1-19 (ESV)

### Jesus and the Miraculous Catch of Fish

After this Jesus revealed Himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and He revealed Himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of His disciples were together. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to Him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered Him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. That disciple who Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work and threw himself into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after He was raised from the dead.

### Jesus and Peter

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to Him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go." (This He said to show by what kind of death He was to glorify God.) And after saying this He said to him, "Follow me."

## Family Discussion:

1. Why did the disciples go fishing?
2. Why do you think they weren't catching any fish?
3. Do you like to fish? Why or why not?
4. Why didn't the disciples listen to Jesus when He told them where to fish?
5. How did the disciples realize that it was Jesus who was standing on the shore and talking to them?
6. Why do you think Peter jumped out of the boat and swam to the shore?
7. How can we listen to Jesus?
